Directions: Travel along A148 towards Sheringham, turn off towards Sheringham on A1082. Take the first turning on the right signed for car park and Pretty Corner Tea rooms. O signs will be placed on A148 before the junction.

Parking: In small car park on minor road to Pretty Corner Tea rooms.

Registration: Open from 10:00am to 12:00am

Course Descriptions: are printed alongside the map – text for white, yellow courses. I.O.F. symbols for Orange to Brown courses. Loose descriptions are issued at registration - your passport to a map

Special Features: Hide = black X Carved post = black ⊙

Start & Finish: The Start and Finish are close to the Registration and Car Park area. The Start is 150m from the car park and the Finish is 70m from the car park.

Times: All courses start from 10:15am through to 12:15am. Courses close at 14:15hrs.
You must report to the Download tent near registration by 14:30hrs.
Please immediately report to the download tent if you are still out on your course at this time.

Terrain: Pretty Corner is steeply contoured, being part of the Cromer Ridge, formed at the end of the last Ice Age. Courses have been planned to take into account the steepness of the area.
The forest area is devoid of bracken, but there is abundance of dead bracken in some rough open areas. There are some areas of slow undergrowth but this is not as extensive as in previous years, possibly due to the cold and wet winter.
With the recent rainfall, Paths and Tracks are extremely muddy and slippery, plus the valley sides are very soft underfoot.
There are numerous small seasonal paths which are not mapped.

Pretty Corner is a public access forest used by walkers, horse riders and cyclists amongst others. Please respect other forest users.

Facilities: None on site. Nearest public toilets are in Sheringham.

Dogs: Please keep Dogs on lead.
